Using WordPress: Posts vs. Pages

Posts and pages may look similar, but they serve different functions in WordPress.

Tip: Your WordPress site is not required to use posts. You can just use pages and it will function like a regular website. If you do create posts, they will appear on a special page that lists them in reverse chronological order (newest first). You can configure your site's homepage to show your posts or it can be a different page on your site.
