## Florida Museum of Natural History Junior Volunteer Program Position Descriptions Summer 2024

<u>Discovery Carts</u> - Oversee a cart that contains sensory items for visitors. There is a discovery cart for each museum exhibit. Each cart comes with a manual with information about the items you will display. You will learn about the cart throughout the week and share your knowledge with museum visitors. You should enjoy learning and sharing information. You do not need to be a public speaking superstar, but you do need to want to improve your public engagement skills. You may be stationed by yourself, so you must be able to work alone. Shift times: 9:45am-1:30pm OR 1:15 – 5:00pm (Mon-Fri)

<u>Discovery Zone Assistant</u> - Engage visitors of all ages but mostly children ages 0-8 with hands-on activities at the entrance of the Discovery Zone. You must be friendly, outgoing, and willing to engage/assist visitors. You will help set up and clean up after activities and must be self-motivated. On Tuesdays we will head outside with our Tot Trot program to help young visitors explore nature. You should enjoy interacting with young children and experience is helpful. *Shift times: 9:45am-1:30pm (Mon-Fri)* 

Exhibit Docents - You will be stationed throughout the Museum exhibits, including "Incredible Insects," and will be expected to learn about the exhibit and engage visitors. You'll share information and point out the interactive areas and interesting facts. You'll also provide general Museum information as needed. You must be approachable, enjoy learning and sharing information, and be comfortable talking (or have a desire to improve your public engagement skills) to visitors of all ages. Shift times: 9:45am-1:30pm OR 1:15 – 5:00pm (Mon-Fri)

<u>Ichthyology (Fishes) Lab Assistant</u> — Work with and learn from world renowned scientists in the new, state-of-the-art, Special Collections Building! You'll learn how to sort and identify fish specimens to species, and you will work on care, maintenance, and management issues of the cataloged collection. This collection is second only to the Smithsonian fish collection in specimen records. **This role requires 2 weeks of service, preferably non-consecutive) and is only available to returning JVs.** Shift times: 9:45am-1:30pm OR 1:15 — 5:00pm (Mon-Fri)

Incredible Insects Exhibit assistant- Work in conjunction with the <u>Daniels lab</u> in the live lab of the Incredible Insects exhibit. Our research efforts are directed towards the conservation of particularly vulnerable butterfly species in their natural habitats and the broader pollinator community in urban and suburban environments. Learn about the research our lab performs and help translate this research to our visitors when they visit the live lab. Assist with care for insects on display, including feeding and cleaning insect enclosures. Learn about native insect species of Florida and speak with the public about these species. This position may also assist with active research projects that are featured in the live lab. If you have a passion for insects and enjoy engaging with the public, you would be well suited for this role. **This role is only available to returning JVs.** Shift times: 9:45am-1:30pm (Mon-Fri)

Please read and follow these instructions carefully. **INCOMPLETE/ LATE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FOR THE PROGRAM!** It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure all information has been provided and the application is submitted by the deadline.

#### **PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:**

Please consider your ability to meet these requirements before submitting an application:

- 1. All Junior Volunteers must attend a mandatory orientation June 2 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.
- 2. Applicants must be 14 years or older by June 2, 2024.
- 3. All new applicants will be interviewed between March 11-22 (date options and interview details will be emailed by February 28). These interviews are informal and will be offered in-person and via zoom.
- 4. All positions are <u>half-day</u>. Transportation for mid-day drop-off/pick-up is required, as participants may not stay at the Museum all day.
- 5. You will be expected to serve the complete sessions to which you commit. Absences may affect future participation in the program.
- 6. All applicants accepted into the Junior Volunteer Program must pay a program fee (\$30 Museum members/\$35 non-members) before the orientation on June 2. Scholarships are available. Please contact Amy Hester for scholarship information, 352-273-2055 or ahester@flmnh.ufl.edu.

#### **INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMITTING YOUR APPLICATION:**

- 1. Keep a copy of the application and your responses for your records.
- Complete and return application pages 1, 2, and 3. Late applications will NOT be considered for the program.
- 3. If you are submitting the application by email, help me recognize legitimate submissions by doing the following:
  - include your name in the file name
  - include your name/JV application/some identifier in subject line
  - include 1-2 sentences stating your name and that you've attached an application
  - send email from a non-suspicious email address
