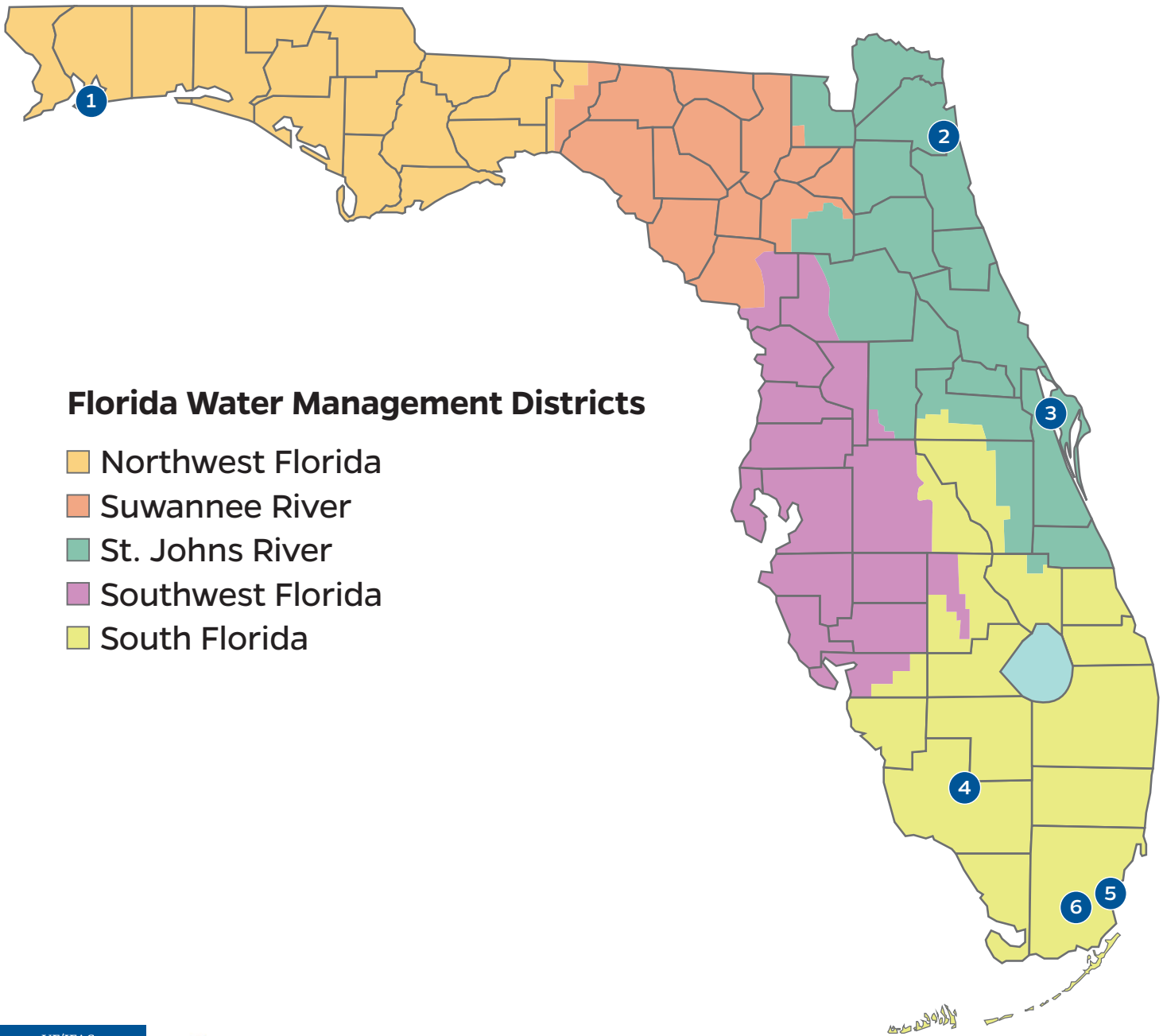


The Economic Impact of *Florida's Coastal National Parks*



In 2018, Florida's coastal national parks were visited by more than **9 million** visitors, who spent over **\$630 million** in local economies, supporting **6,410** jobs.
